Through the gift of our Baptism, Incorporation, and Ordination, we have been filled with the Holy Spirit to undertake this wonderful task. In doing so, we deepen our faith in Jesus as he prepares us to live this discipleship each day.

The Holy Spirit works through us, and it means that Jesus promises to give us the words we will need.

Take a moment today to thank Jesus for sending you out, for being a Missionary of the Precious Blood, for using your individual gifts and talents that make Jesus known. Let him know how you feel.

SPIRITUALITY: TRIUMPH OF THE CROSS

PART OF THE SERVICE ON GOOD FRIDAY INCLUDES THE VENERATION OF

THE CROSS. This gesture is an expression of our love and devotion to the sacredness of the Cross. Later during the liturgical year, the Church remembers and celebrates the Cross, with the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross, on September 14.

The Cross of Jesus, first and foremost, speaks about the victory of obedience to God's will. For some non-Christians, the cross is merely two pieces of wood joined together; for Christians, it is a sign of victory over death; and for Catholics, the cross represents a mystery of Jesus' passion and death, obedience, forgiveness and an act of love.



We who adore the cross: it speaks to us of hope in the victorious power of God who raises his Son from the dead. Jesus transforms an instrument of death into a symbol of love for us to imitate. Jesus had preached the wonderful truth of loving one's enemies; of being able to love others as one loves oneself. At the Last Supper, he encouraged his disciples to love one another as he had loved them.

Then at the Cross, Jesus showed us how to forgive. He was able to forgive all those who doubted him, betrayed him, denied him, persecuted him and put him to death. The Feast of the Triumph of the Cross is, in essence, the triumph of love.

St. Gaspar writes to a community member, *May the Crucifix be our book; therein do we read to learn how to act.* (Letter 2368) And in another letter, he says, *Let us be united more and more to the Cross of Jesus, which is the only book that brings comfort, and, in the Heart of Jesus, let us incessantly have regard for each other.* (Letter 1761)

It is important to have the body of Jesus on the cross, the crucifix — or else, it remains merely a symbol of pain and suffering. With the image of Jesus on the cross, it acquires a fuller meaning of hope, faith, love, and new life. St. Edith Stein noted: *The cross has no purpose of itself. It rises on high and points above. But it is not merely a sign — it is Christ's powerful weapon; the shepherd's staff with which the Divine David moves against the hellish Goliath; with it he strikes mightily against heaven's gate and throws it wide open.*

The cross teaches us acceptance and obedience. The cross is a meaningful symbol of Jesus' obedience to his Father. Jesus obeyed the Father's will throughout his life unto death. As Jesus accepted in obedience, he was lifted up, the gift of the Resurrection; so too, God will raise us. In the risen Lord, Christ shares his life with us in and through the Holy Spirit.

How many times do we struggle or even refuse what God is calling us to do? When God's will is spoken through the Church, our superiors, in prayer? We tell ourselves that we cannot possibly do what God wants of us. My intention is better. We grumble, complain, find excuses, rant, do what we want, and deceive people. Jesus accepted the cross unto death, in doing so, his love for his Father was true and faithful. As we bring our life experiences and sacrifices to the cross, may we find new life from the Crucified Jesus as he fills our hearts with the power of the cross.

Let us celebrate the Triumph of the Cross with zeal and charity so that it



MINUTES OF PROVINCIAL COUNCIL MEETING

MONDAY, AUGUST 14, 2023

6:30 PM

ATTENDANCE

PRESENT: V. Rev. Luigino Santi, Rev. Samuel D'Angelo, Rev. Jerome Hologa, Rev. Patrick Gilmurray

CALL TO ORDER

All being present, V. Rev. Luigino Santi called the meeting to order at 6:20 pm.

OPENING PRAYER

V. Rev. Luigino Santi led the opening prayer.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Motion to approve the minutes of the previous Council Meeting held on Monday, May 29, 2023 was made by Fr. Sam, seconded by Fr. Jerome. 3 in favor, 1 abstention. **Carried.**

TREASURER'S REPORT

Rev. Peter Nobili joined the meeting to present a financial update to the Council.

- ▶ Fr. Peter reported that the sale of the Assiniboine property had been finalized. The proceeds from the sale were used to repay all outstanding loans and mortgages. There was no residual profit from the sale.
- ▶ Fr. Peter reported on the balance of the Merlini Account used to pay for the education of students. Currently, only Fr. Jerome's salary from the Development Office is income for this account. Details of the financial arrangements surrounding our current candidate's expenses for the next year were discussed.
- ▶ Fr. Peter gave an overview of the current efforts to divest the Bathurst Street property. The proceeds from a previous, forfeited deposit have been received and will be distributed to the appropriate accounts.
- ▶ Fr. Peter outlined a number of projects that have been identified and initiated with respect to the maintenance and repair of the Niagara property. The timing and cost of the projects are being impacted by a scarcity of labor and material.

MEXICAN MISSION

Fr. Lui outlined a number of significant challenges surrounding the Mexican Mission. Among these, personnel issues and options for future ministry of our members in Mexico were discussed.

PERU

Fr. Lui presented several Working Documents that will be used for discussion at the next MMS to be held in Peru this September. The MMS will focus on formulating policies on misconduct, internet and computer use, website development and social media engagement. The Generalate is also interested in forming a C.P.P.S. Communications Office. At the last General Assembly, a number of Core Values were presented for future discussion. Some follow-up on these is also anticipated.

PERSONNEL

A number of personnel issues were discussed.

VOCATION OFFICE

Fr. Samuel gave a summary of his activities this year and will prepare a formal budget for the Vocation Office for discussion/approval. The composition of the Formation/Vocation Committee may need to be revised. The status of an enquirer was discussed.

MISSION OFFICE

► Fr. Jerome advised the Council that a number of necessary personnel changes had been made in the Water Project. Fr. Jerome's deputy, Fr. Eugene Nchimbi, has assumed the position of Director of the Water Project. Fr. Jerome provided the Council with a financial update of the schools and Water Project.

► Prospects and options regarding the future of the Water Project were discussed. Fr. Jerome will outline details of these to the Council, especially to our donors, as soon as possible, following receipt of a report from Tanzania. This is expected before the end of this year.

► Fr. Lui will visit Tanzania next year.

LEGISLATIVE MATTERS

The possibility of changing the process of determining the recipient(s) of the Province's donations to charities which are decided at assemblies, was discussed. More research will be needed, and information forthcoming.

USC

Changes to the focus of events of the USC were discussed. Rather than a large annual gathering at Niagara in August, a calendar of dates and events has been set for smaller gatherings at the local level throughout the year. Ways of improving the functioning and coordination of the USC and integration with the Development Office were discussed.

FORMATION

Fr. Patrick expressed his desire for training as Formator. It was suggested that he attend the Religious Formation Conference to be held in November. Fr. Patrick will meet with our current candidate as soon as his sabbatical is concluded. A plan for the formation of our current candidate beyond this coming year will be developed and, if approved by the Vocation/Formation Committee, will be presented together with a budget for Council discussion/approval.

OTHER BUSINESS


A number of *Standing Reports* will be identified. These will be provided prior to future Council meetings for increased efficiency.


